Canadian Association of Principals (CAP) Student Leadership Award – One per school

One student is nominated, based on leadership activities in the school and community, on academic achievement and a 250 word essay. Applications are available online at <http://www.cdnprincipals.org> . Deadlines by which you must submit an application to your school will vary. More than likely the school deadlines will be at the beginning of February. See your guidance counselor for more info.

Deadline: March 1

Odd Fellows Rebekahs of Saskatchewan – 6 x \$1000

Students applying do not have to have a connection with the Independent Order of Odd Fellows & Rebekahs but must show definite promise and a need for financial assistance. Hill-Ivey HBA Option (U of R) - \$40 000

This new program option allows SK students admission into the Hill-Ivey Scholar program. Qualified students will begin the first two years of their degree through the Hill School of Business and complete the final two years of their program at the Richard Ivey School of business at the University of Western Ontario. This option is available to SK grade 12 students with an Early Conditional Admission Average of 90% and substantive leadership and community involvement. Awards will be presented to qualifying grade 12 students from across Western Canada. Students will be required to write a short essay, maximum 1250 words; students are encouraged to demonstrate their passion for one of the following topics: leadership, sports, performing arts, technology or trades, fine arts, community/volunteer service.

The Colonel Douglas H. Gunter History Awards – 5 x \$1000

Open to all senior students who plan on graduating from secondary school in this year. To qualify, each student must submit an original work using one of the following media: text, visual art, web design or audio or video production. Every year, the Canadian War Museum selects a theme on which students must base their work. For more information and this year's theme go to the link above.

Garfield Weston Awards - up to 25 awards, waive tuition, \$8000 for up to two years, summer programming, and mentorship

The program is designed to recognize outstanding college-bound students who show a strong commitment to their fields of study and are interested in making positive contributions to their communities. A list of participating colleges can be found in the application package (SIAS, Lakeland, Mount Royal, Olds, SIAS, SAIT, NAIT, Grande Prairie, Grant MacEwan, among others). Selection will be based on if the student is passionate about his or her field of study; curious, courageous, and willing to try new things; and community-minded and truly interested in becoming involved and making a difference in society. You must be a Canadian citizen, presently completing grade 12 or have been out of school for a minimum of three years, entering his/her full-time studies in the fall and have a minimum of 75%. STF Post-Secondary Entrance Prizes – multiple awards at \$1000

To be eligible applicants must have a natural parent, adoptive parent or legal guardian who, in the school year has: paid STF membership fees, or is receiving an allowance under the Teachers Superannuation Plan or the SK Teachers Retirement Plan or has died while a STF member in one of the three categories given above, or is on board leave, etc. Students must be registered at an accredited post-secondary educational institution in the next school year. Students must be graduating this year or graduated from school within the last three years. You can pick up an application form from your guidance counselor or contact STF at 1-800-667-7762.

A.E. Blakeney Sasktel Bursary – 1 x \$40 000

This bursary is awarded biannually in these years: 2004, 2006, 2008, 2010, 2012. The bursary is available to support an outstanding SK student in his/her post-secondary studies. The bursary recipient will be awarded \$10 000 annually for a period of four years. Student eligibility is based on financial need; high academic standing; SK resident (Canadian citizen or landed immigrant); full-time university student. Saskatchewan Golf Association – Several Scholarships (High School 2 x \$250, many post-secondary ones) <http://www.saskgolf.ca/>

To be eligible you must be a resident of SK; be a current member of the SK Golf Association; be a full course of academic studies at a recognized high school institution or post-secondary institution; and have played in the previous year provincial championship. Students who are still in high school must have a minimum academic average of 80%, students who are completing grade 12 this year must have a minimum of 80% for high school; or must have a minimum of 70% for post-secondary.
